GUIDELINES FOR PARISH PREPARATION OF YOUNG PEOPLE FOR CONFIRMATION IN THE DIOCESE OF SCRANTON

Age considerations

O Young people in 9th grade or above are invited to participate in a process of preparation for the Sacrament of Confirmation. Direct preparation for Confirmation takes place at the parish where the young person presently worships and/or is registered. Catholic schools do not offer preparation programs for Confirmation, and eligible young people will celebrate Confirmation in their own parish.

Sponsors

- o Sponsors for Confirmation must meet the requirements as in Canon Law:
 - At least sixteen years old and have received all three sacraments of initiation;
 - Lead a life in harmony with the Catholic faith;
 - Not bound by any penalty of the Church;
 - Not the parent of the person to be confirmed
- O In addition, the sponsors must be able to participate in the preparation process and willing to serve as a guide, confidente and listener. This assumes the local residency of the sponsor and that he or she has a positive and comfortable relationship with the candidate.

Enrollment process/ Celebration Dates and Host Parishes

O Annually, parishes will be asked to enroll the candidates who are seeking Confirmation within the given year. Based on this response, a specific number of Confirmation celebrations will be scheduled with Host Parishes, and the dates/locations published well in advance. In this way, most celebrations will include candidates from several parishes together.

• Interactions with Presiding Bishop

- o It is no longer necessary but encouraged to prepare students by having them memorize a fixed set of "questions for the Bishop." However, the Bishop will still interact with them either before Mass or during the homily, and will invite them to respond to such questions as:
 - What does receiving the sacrament of Confirmation mean to you?
 - What is one way you have seen the gospel message of Jesus being lived out in your parish?
 - How do you intend to put your faith into action over the next few years?
 - What gifts do you want to share with your parish community?
 - How can your parish community continue to support you in your faith journey?

• Confirmation Name

o It is most appropriate to be confirmed with one's baptismal name, thereby reaffirming and bearing witness to the unity of the sacraments of initiation and the baptismal promises. Whether the young person is confirmed with his/her baptismal name, or chooses a new name for Confirmation, they are also strongly encouraged to have a very clear reason for the choice and how the patron saint or namesake provides them a model of lived faith.

• Service Hours

- o The purpose of service hours for Confirmation is not simply to attain a certain number of hours but to grow in the virtue of charity, and emphasis and build community. The requirements are:
 - 10 hours in Community
 - 10 hours in Parish
 - Service projects with class
 - Or any combination thereof

• Sacramental Catechesis

- Each parish is tasked with the immediate preparation for the sacrament of Confirmation. The parish program is responsible for:
 - Promoting Knowledge of the Faith
 - Promoting Participation in Liturgy and Sacraments
 - Integrating Moral Formation and Life
 - Teaching to Pray

- Initiation into the life of the Church
- Promoting Missionary Spirit
- o In order to cover these six key areas, Most Holy Trinity Parish will hold six mandatory catechetical preparation classes and a mandatory class retreat for the sacrament of Confirmation. Each class will begin with the 4pm Mass on Saturday and conclude at 6:00pm at the Parish Center. Attendance is mandatory and failure to participate will delay the reception of the sacrament.
- o Class dates will be announced at the parent meeting.

• Dress Code

- o Confirmation is not graduation. Being Catholic means that learning to love God more deeply is a lifelong process and commitment. To help dispel the notion of the sacrament as graduation, gowns will no longer be worn.
- The following are minimal diocesan guidelines for attire:
 - Young Men should wear dress slacks, dress shirt with tie, and dress shoes. A suit jacket may also be worn, but is optional. Shoes should be sensible for safety when walking. No jeans, sneakers or flip flops.
 - Young women should wear attire appropriate in length and style. Dresses or blouses will have a modest neckline with no bare shoulders. Shoes should be sensible for safety when walking. No jeans, sneakers or flip flops.

CONFIRMATION NAME

As a candidate for the Sacrament of Confirmation, you have two options concerning the choice of a Confirmation name:

- 1. Stay with your present Baptismal name (your first name). This shows the sacramental connection with the first and second part of your initiation into the Catholic Church Baptism and First Eucharist. To stay with your baptismal name would demonstrate that you feel there has been a continual growth in your faith and you now wish to make this formal through Confirmation.
- 2. Select a saint's name symbolizing a new beginning in your faith life and a connection with that particular saint.

Selecting a Saint's Name

When taking a name other than your baptismal name, the candidate for Confirmation selects the name of a person who has officially been declared a saint, blessed, or venerable by the Church or a person who is one of the faithful from the Bible.

How to select a Saint's name?

1. Life-time saint friends.

Candidates should recognize that they are not simply choosing a name they like, but they are asking a saint to be their friend for the rest of their lives. We call these life-time saint friends "patrons." Patrons help us live as Christians both through their praying for us (intercession) and their good example (witness). (cf. CCC 2156, 956)

2. Read stories about the Saints.

More than likely, candidates are not too familiar with many saints. Take time read the lives of the saints. There are many different books on saints. The internet also has many different websites on the saints. One place to start is to search websites such as the following:

You might start your reading with a saint that has similar interests. Sometimes, patrons are chosen because of their feast day falls on your birthday ... e.g. if your birthday is November 3, you would chose Martin for St. Martin de Porres. Sometimes, patrons might be chosen because of family ties, e.g. a grandfather's name is Mark, grandpa is a great person, so you would choose St. Mark. You might even start with your own baptismal name. There are many different starting points for choosing a particular saint. Ultimately, the patron chosen should be someone that you want to imitate in his/her love for Christ and others.

Role and Responsibility of Catholic Sponsor

A Sponsor is someone who gives spiritual guidance and encouragement to the person who is preparing to receive the sacrament of Confirmation; someone who will help the candidate live out his/her baptismal promises now and in the future

What are the requirements to be a sponsor for Confirmation?

Can. 893 §1. To perform the function of sponsor, a person must fulfill the conditions mentioned in can. 874.

§2. It is desirable to choose as sponsor the one who undertook the same function in baptism.

Can. 874 §1. To be permitted to take on the function of sponsor a person must:

- 1. be designated by the one to be baptized, by the parents or the person who takes their place, or in their absence by the pastor or minister and have the aptitude and intention of fulfilling this function.
- 2. have completed the sixteenth year of age, unless the diocesan bishop has established another age, or the pastor or minister has granted an exception for a just cause;
- 3. be a Catholic who has been confirmed and has already received the most holy sacrament of the Eucharist and who leads a life of faith in keeping with the function to be taken on;
- 4. not be bound by any canonical penalty legitimately imposed or declared;
- 5. not be the father or mother of the one to be baptized.
- §2. A baptized person who belongs to a non-Catholic ecclesial community is not to participate except together with a Catholic sponsor and then only as a witness of the baptism.

The **Sponsor** will need to obtain a **letter of eligibility** / sponsor card from the parish in which he/she is currently registered and active. Additionally, sponsor will need a copy of his/her **Confirmation certificate** (obtained from the parish of Confirmation or Baptism).
